Emerald Ash Borer found in Sherwood

The Village received a news release from the Wisconsin Depart. of Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection (DATCP) confirming the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) in Sherwood. A quarantine is in effect for Calumet County.

According to the release, "the Calumet County infestation was found in the Village of Sherwood, just north of High Cliff Public Golf Course, about four miles from the Outagamie County line."

As a result of the County quarantine, the DATCP highly discourages moving firewood within quarantined counties, considering most infestations are a result of the movement of firewood. "EAB is one of a number of forest pests and diseases that can easily and invisibly move from one location to another under the bark of firewood." Reducing the distance movement, reduces the likelihood of spread of the pest.

The DATCP recommends:

- Watch for signs of EAB infestation (thinning canopy, D-shaped holes in bark, cracked bark, and branches sprouting low on the trunk).
- Consider preventative treatments on your property (within 15 miles of infestation).
- Consider planting tree species that are not susceptible to EAB.

Bulk Item Pick-Up

Date: Monday — May 18

This is the **ONLY** bulk item pick-up date for the Village. Please note that items must be at curbside by 6 AM to ensure pick-up.

Items accepted for collection include: Furniture, rolled carpeting (4 foot maximum length), cabinets, countertops, mattresses/bed springs, non-metal doors, wood windows, wooden playground equipment, large appliances with out Freon (stoves, washers, dryers, etc. allowed if item can be handled by two people safely).

Excluded items for collection include: Uncontainerized items or piles of construction material, tires, batteries, TVs/DVD players/VCRs, computer equipment (see page 6 for electronics disposal opportunities under "Calumet County" section), liquid, yard waste items, engines/products run on petroleum, and electronic items banned from landfills.

Freon-containing items (refrigerators, AC units, freezers, old dehumidifiers) are also prohibited for collection. If you have an appliance with Freon, please contact the Village Office to find out how to properly dispose the item. ▲

Ordinances & Regulations

NUISANCES (#94-52)

NOXIOUS WEEDS — Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes, Section 66.96 and Section 3(f) of Village of Sherwood Ordinance 52, notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the Village of Sherwood, Calumet County, WI to DESTROY ALL NOXIOUS WEEDS AND CUT RANK GROWTH on such property. Noxious weeds are: Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge, Field Bindweed (Creeping Jenny), Lythrum (Purple Loosestrife), and Multiflora Rose. **Photographs and additional information on noxious weeds are on our website, www.villageofsherwood.org. Be sure to go to Resident Information > Noxious Weeds and Invasive Plant Species.**

Rank growth includes lawns, grasses, and other vegetative growth on undeveloped lots or platted parcels of land which exceed **eight (8) inches in length** except for property in designated floodplain, wetland, or storm water detention areas.

If you fail to comply to the parcel vegetative height allowance, a subcontractor will destroy all weeds and rank growth at the expense of the owner and said charges (costs associated with subcontractor plus Village municipal fees, which are more severe for each offense) shall be billed if left unpaid. ▲

NOISE — Nice weather brings people outdoors. Please be considerate of your neighbors. Windows are open, welcoming the fresh air; be aware of noise pollution especially during night hours (10 PM to 7 AM). Besides prohibiting noxious weeds, Village Ordinance 94-52 prohibits public nuisances such as animals running at large, fireworks, junk vehicles, and loud and unnecessary noise. ▲

DOGS — Please be considerate of your neighbors and don't let your dog roam outside the yard or bark excessively. When walking around the neighborhood or on one of our many trails, please pick up your litter and clean up after Fido. Dogs must be licensed, leashed and within your control. ▲

Springtime Election Information

The spring election will be held on Tuesday, April 7 to elect judicial, educational school board and municipal officers.



The Village President and 3 Village Trustee offices are on the ballot. Village President Jim Rath is running unopposed. Three Village Board trustee incumbents Bob Benz, Stacy Gedman, and Roger Kaas are running for office along with Terri Hastie.

Also, included on the ballot is State Supreme Court Justice, School District School Board Member races for Hilbert and Kaukauna schools.

The polling place is open from 7 AM to 8 PM and is located at the Village Hall Gym, W482 Clifton Rd.

If you are registering at the polling place on Election Day, you must have resided in Sherwood at least 28 consecutive days preceding the election and provide proof of residency. You may also register or vote absentee at the Village office prior between Monday, March 23 and Friday, April 3.

202 Dogs Remain Unlicensed



Starting April 1, a \$5 late fee will be charged in addition to the licensing fee. The fee for a neutered male or spayed female is \$5; an unaltered dog is \$10. **Proof of a current rabies vaccination is required.** This year's licenses are RED. If your dog's tag is GOLD, it is expired. Please renew.

For your convenience, you may handle your license renewal by mail; please include proof of rabies vaccination, license fee (include an extra \$5 after March 31) and a **self-addressed, stamped envelope**. Late fees are waived for newly acquired dogs or puppies.

Neighbors and meter readers also reported several unlicensed dogs. Keep in mind it is State law that all dogs over 5 months must be licensed.

If you no longer have your pet, please contact the Village Office, and we will remove your dog from the database.

Bird City Update

By now you've heard the "Konk-a-REE" of the Red-Winged Blackbird, the early arriving songbird of the marsh. This species is highly dimorphic meaning that the female plumage is nothing like the male but she is spectacular in her heavily streaked blends of rich cream, caramel and charcoal grey tones.

You'll recognize her as the stealthy bird low in the cat-tails where she builds her nest, typically below a singing male sentry. The male Red-Winged Blackbird is not monogamous so there are likely several nesting females in his small aggressively defended territory. Read more about this and other songbirds on the Audubon website <https://www.audubon.org/field-guide/bird/red-winged-blackbird>.

High Cliff State Park is a prime birding destination because of the varied habitats and draw of Lake Winnebago. Watch for Baltimore and Orchard Orioles along the Butterfly Pond Trail, Clay-colored Sparrows and Eastern Meadowlarks in the rolling fields near the Horse Trail Parking lot. Visit the park website <http://friendsofhighcliff.org/> for birding hikes being offered on International Migratory Bird Day on May 9th and throughout the season.

May 1 at 6:00 AM kicks off the birding fun with a hike starting at the Marina. Bring binoculars or stop by the Park office a day or two beforehand and get a loaner. I look forward to guiding you.

Eastern Bluebirds are arriving to fill the many nest boxes we humans have installed. Be a good landlord. You must toss the nest materials of the European House Sparrows from these boxes EVERY day as they will kill the native Bluebird you want to attract. Or trap them <http://www.sparrowtraps.net?clid=COB778LZ18MCFZPm7Aody1EA> g.

Sherwood Water & Sewer Utility

What is a Cross Connection?

A cross connection is an actual or potential connection between the safe drinking water (potable) supply and a source of contamination or pollution. State plumbing codes require approved backflow prevention methods to be installed at every point of potable water connection and use. Cross-connections must be properly protected or eliminated.

How does contamination occur?

When you turn on your faucet, you expect the water to be as safe as when it left the treatment plant. However, certain hydraulic conditions left unprotected within your plumbing system may allow hazardous substances to contaminate your own drinking water or even the public water supply.

Backsiphonage — May occur due to a loss of pressure in the municipal water system during a fire fighting emergency, a water main break or system repair. This creates a siphon in your plumbing system, which can draw water out of a sink or bucket and back into your water or the public water system.

Backpressure — May be created when a source of pressure (such as a boiler) creates a pressure greater than the pressure supplied from the public water system. This may cause contaminated water to be pushed into your plumbing system through an unprotected cross connection.

— IN THE BATHROOM —


Hand Held Shower Fixture

A hand held shower is compliant if:

- 1 — When shower head is hanging freely, it is at least 1" above top of the flood level rim of the receptor (tub)
- 2 — Complies with **ASSE#1014**
- 3 — Has the **ASME code 112.18.1** stamped on the handle



1" Minimum AIR GAP Above Tub From Fixture Outlet




Toilet Tanks

There are many unapproved toilet tank fill valve products sold at common retailers which do not meet the state plumbing code requirements for backflow prevention:

- 1 — Look for the **ASSE #1002 Standard** symbol on the device and packaging
- 2 — Replace any unapproved devices with **ASSE #1002** approved anti-siphon ball-cock assembly. Average cost is typically \$12 to \$22 at home improvement stores.
- 3 — Verify overflow tube is 1" below critical level (CL) marking on the device.

ASSE #1002 Approved Ball Cock Assembly




Insights to Protect Your Drinking Water...

Do: 1 — Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants.

2 — Make sure dishwashers are installed with a proper "air gap" device.

3 — Verify and install a **hose bibb vacuum breaker** on all threaded faucets around your home.




4 — Make sure water treatment devices such as water softeners have the proper "air gap", which is a minimum of 1" inch above any drain.

Don't: 1 — Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks or ponds.

2 — Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device.

3 — Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems directly to the sewer or submerged drain pipe. Always be sure there is a 1" "air gap" separation.



HYDRANT FLUSHING

The Sherwood Water Department will begin its semi-annual flushing program on April 6 through April 17, excluding weekends. Flushing will be done during daylight hours from 7:30 AM to 3:00 PM.

Customers are advised to check for discoloration prior to washing clothes. If water utility employees are seen working in your area, please use as little, or if possible, no water for 45 minutes to insure the water has settled and discoloration is not drawn into the home's water heater or softener. We advise that you wait until 4:00 PM before washing clothes to minimize potential discoloration.

If discoloration persists, customers are advised to wait another 30-45 minutes, then draw from the discolored water through the COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY. Flushing removes most of the sediment of natural minerals such as iron and sulfur that are harmless, but can discolor water. ▲

PLANNING ON MOVING?

The Public Service Commission (PSC) requires the utility to read the inside meter in order to complete final billing on an account.

When you contact the Village Office to request a final read, you will be required to schedule a date and time for the utility operator to come into the home for a final read of the inside meter. ▲



— IN THE KITCHEN —

Hoses and water treatment devices may create a potential backflow hazard if not properly isolated with backflow prevention methods.



Did You Know...

Your water can become contaminated if connections of your plumbing system are not properly protected! The purpose of the local Cross-Connection Control Program, as required by the State Plumbing Code and Regulations (and WI Dept. of Natural Resources), is to ensure that everyone in the community has safe, clean drinking water.

To avoid contamination, backflow preventers are required by State Plumbing Code wherever there is an actual or potential hazard for cross-connection. All public water suppliers are required to maintain an on-going Cross-Connection Program involving public education, on-site inspections, and possible corrective actions by building owners if required.
