

November hours will be the first three (3) Saturdays only.



## From the Village Administrator...

### Welcome to Summer!

Following last year's opening of Condon Road between the Mobil station at STH 55/114 up to Clifton Road, the Village continues moving forward with implementing components of the *Historic Downtown Master Plan*. Later this Summer, following finalization with WisDOT, the Clifton Road intersection will be closed off at the Post Office when their parking lot area is re-worked and expanded.

The plan (displayed in the rendering above) calls for reorienting parking 90-degrees and into the current roadway section of Clifton Road using the existing asphalt in place. This will create a much safer and quieter space as the stage is set for future commercial development in that immediate area. Meanwhile, Clifton Road will be redirected on to the asphalt that is currently Harrison Street. This will be the new Clifton Road entrance and exit on to STH 55/114.

Regarding development in that area, interested developers have until August to return redevelopment project plans to the Community Development Authority for consideration. Finally, the *Sherwood Cliffs Apartments* will be managed down to zero occupancy during the Summer.

On the construction front, the combination of the past three years' worth of subdivision upgrades and a low-rate lending climate continues to spur single-family residential growth. *Farmington Meadows*, *Mustang Acres*, *Lake Shore Estates-East* and *South* have all seen a lot of activity. If the current building permit trend continues, this year will mark the highest home construction growth rate in over ten years. Last year was the highest at 31 new homes. As of today we already have 27 new home permits on file.

Staff continues trying to keep up with residents' wishes for more and better recreation paths and public recreation spaces.

## From the Village Administrator (Cont'd)...

Now in its third full year of completion, Wanick Park is beginning to 'grow into itself' as the landscaping has taken hold and we are noticing significant growth on the trees and shrubbery. Trail work scheduled for this year will be to complete one westerly section entering into Wanick and re-working 600' of the Nuthatch Trail.

From the *Urban Forestry* side of things, Dept. of Public Works personnel planted 500 seedlings in the *Miller Pond* area to continue upgrading our tree stock and give us a greater variety. We do not want to get caught by any one, single pest (emerald ash borer) or disease (e.g. Oak Wilt; Dutch Elm disease). Next year we will expand our tree planting range using acreage out at the wastewater treatment plant. As tree stock matures, they will be transplanted within the community to our parks, trail and natural areas to help diversify the existing tree varieties at a much less expensive rate compared to buying mature replacement trees.

Within the Office Staff, *Office Coordinator* Val Seidel is getting married! Give her and husband-to-be Tim a 'Congratulations' next time you see her - The big day is June 11<sup>th</sup>.

## Summer Projects Require Permits

If you are planning any construction or remodeling projects, we would like to remind you building permits are required for most projects, including:



**GENERAL PERMITS:** Installation/Replacement of siding and roofing, construction of stoops, ramps, sheds, and home alterations/remodeling projects.

**TRADEWORK PERMITS:** Separate permits are required for any electrical or plumbing work, to ensure your project meets Village zoning regulations and complies with Village and State building codes, but also lets us assist you in achieving a project that is safe and structurally sound.

**LAND USE PERMITS:** Land use permits are also required for the construction, erection, and placement of fences, decks, concrete slabs, patios, pergolas, and decks on properties as well as expansion of existing land use projects. This ensures the location, height, materials and maintenance of projects comply with Village regulations to prevent the creation of nuisances. For more information, contact the Village Office for further clarification.

### Permits must be obtained before work begins.

Residents/Contractors are required to display permits in conspicuous locations. If you see work in your neighborhood being done without a permit, please alert the Village Office.

## Sherwood Water & Sewer

Are you new to the Village of Sherwood? Do you plan on planting a new lawn or doing some major landscaping updates to your yard?

Six years ago this month, the Sherwood finalized the pipeline to the City of Appleton that we use daily for our water source.

Many residents ask if there is any way to receive a discounted rate for planting lawns or doing some major landscaping, and unfortunately, because we receive our water from another municipality, we pay for what is pumped through this pipeline to your homes and what unused water goes through our waste water treatment plant.

You are welcome to submit a request to the Village Board for consideration for a reduction, but from a historic standpoint, no one has been granted a reduction. Thank you for understanding. ▲

## Village-wide Reminder - All Homes Require an E-Sign

Per Village Municipal Code 23 (7-11), all homes and businesses in the Village of Sherwood are required to have a green emergency sign displayed in front of their property (either affixed to their mailbox or on the side on a post). Do you have a new home that does not have one of these signs? Or how about an older home and the sign has gone missing? Please contact the Village Office so we can provide you with a sign. (New homes have their e-sign included in their permit fees — replacements may have a fee to reprint.)

Considering this is a safety-related concern, the Village Office is striving to make sure all homes have these important identification signs for emergency vehicles. If you have alternative identification on your home, it will not supersede this municipal code home requirement. ▲

## Bird City Update

Summer is a wonderful time for bird watching. May is the time of migration and arrival. Birds in June are busy nesting and July is the fledgling season.

*A perfect summer day is when the sun is shining, the breeze is blowing, the birds are singing, and the lawn mower is broken.*

Even if your lawn mower is not broken there are some easy ways to attract birds to your yard and neighborhood.

Birds love insects, berries, seeds and nuts so think about planting Wisconsin native trees and shrubs in your yard. There are lots of websites to help you find native plants that attract birds such as:

Offer water in a birdbath. Regularly cleaning your birdbath at least weekly and keeping it filled with fresh water will help keep birds healthy and returning to your yard.

Bird feeders filled with black oil sunflower seeds and thistle will bring birds to your yard. Clean your feeders regularly, and make sure to feed a quality product.

Nesting boxes allow birds to make a home next to yours. Unpainted wood is best for most nest boxes, as it can "breathe" more easily and keeps the box from getting too hot.

There are lots of perfect summer days ahead so follow these simple steps and the birds in your yard will be happy and healthy. Enjoy! ▲

## Medications Disposal


Old or unused medications can be safely disposed of at the following safe drop off 24/hour locations:

- **Appleton Police Dept. Safe Drug Drop Box** — 222 South Walnut Street, Appleton
- **Brillion Police Dept. Safe Drug Drop Box** — 130 Calumet Street, Brillion
- **Calumet County Sheriff Safe Drug Drop Box** — 206 Court Street, Chilton
- **Menasha Police Dept. Safe Drug Drop Box** — 430 1st Street, Menasha

Household pharmaceuticals accepted at the drop-off box include prescription and over-the-counter human and pet medications such as pills, capsules, ointments, liquids, sprays, drops, creams, inhalers, vials or any other drug no longer needed for its intended purpose. No needles, intravenous solutions, or non-medication waste. **Contact Calumet County Health Dept. at 920-849-1432 for safe needle disposal.**

Keep medications in the original container with the medication name kept visible. Personal identification information such as name and address on prescription labels can be crossed off with a black marker. Use of these drop box services is free. ▲

## Electronics Ban Reminder



Effective Sept. 1, 2010, Wisconsin's Electronics Recycling Law (2009 Act 50) prohibits disposal of certain electronic devices in Wisconsin landfills, burning in an incineration facility, or placing these devices in a container intended for disposal or incineration.

This ban does not require a solid waste treatment or disposal facility to retrieve a consumer video display device (a television or computer monitor with a tube or a screen that is at least 7" in its longest diagonal measurement) if doing so is impractical or would jeopardize the safety of a worker, or if the device has been damaged to the extent that recycling is no longer practical or feasible.

Electronic devices included in the ban are computers, printers, video display devices, peripherals, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs, and other video players (i.e. DVRs).

If you'd like to get rid of your electronics, please utilize Outagamie County's Recycling Center (1919 Holland Road, Appleton, 54911. Find out hours of operation and accepted items at [www.recyclomoreoutagamie.org](http://www.recyclomoreoutagamie.org).

Advanced Disposal Landfill, Calumet County, and local governments have coordinated to offer local drop off options for the safe disposal of hazardous wastes and used electronics.

Hazardous wastes are products whose labels include the words caution, poison, combustible, danger, warning, flammable, or corrosive. Hazardous wastes that can be brought to the disposal program include, but are not limited to, solvents, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides, rodent baits, lead and oil based paints, kitchen and bathroom cleaners, bug sprays, old gasoline, transmission fluid and antifreeze. **Latex paint IS NOT ACCEPTED.** ▲

## SPLASH PAD HOURS & INFO

### Requirements (per WI State Regulations):

- Temperature outside must be 63 degrees Fahrenheit or warmer.
- Must not be raining outside (or have rain in the forecast); inclement weather is subject to shut off the water feature.

### To Turn Feature on:

- Gate is a safety feature – lift latch open on any gate to enter splash pad.
- Locate one of the two green pillars inside the splash pad feature and tap the button on top. Splash pad feature will run in 3-minute cycle, whereupon the feature must be reactivated by pressing another pillar button.

### Hours of Operation:

- Open from Memorial Day (5/30) through Labor Day (9/5) from 9 AM to 9 PM.
- **Please note:** Splash pad will automatically shut down due to mechanical or chemical-related issues without notice. We apologize for any inconvenience in advance. We will try and fix problems as soon as possible.




### Inside Out


