Note: When Lake District takes ownership, they will need to carry the insurance. Friday replied Ms. Hase informed him the properties will not need to be rezoned. Friday explained the Dam Failure Analysis shall be completed before the construction and repairs can commence.

Based on our discussion and the proposed Change Order No. 3 from Solutions 101 to complete the construction in 2020, Cedar has reviewed the information and is providing a brief history of the Project for the Village Board to review. The Dam Failure Analysis was completed in April of 2019. The analysis has been approved by the WDNR. The Village of Sherwood presented the results of the analysis to residents. Various concerns were raised at the meeting. As a result, the Village has asked for additional modeling and evaluations. The review is as follows, any changes to the modeling that has been approved to date will require additional engineering and report submittals to the WDNR for approval.

The concerns are summarized below in red and the results are summarized following the concerns in black. The cross sections referenced are number the same for each branch due to the WDNR modeling requirements. When reviewing the concern, identify the location of the modeling.

1. Provide a Dam Failure analysis assuming the proposed second culvert is not added to the dam control structure.

The dam control structure consists of a concrete weir which drains into a culvert under Palisades Trail. For this analysis the size of the concrete weir was adjusted to match the limiting flow capacity of the existing culvert. The results of the model as shown in table 1.

Conclusion:

Reducing the amount of flow the dam can pass resulted in a higher water surface elevation in the pond and a higher downstream flood elevations when the dam failed. The higher pond elevation will increase the downstream flow when the dam fails from 560 cfs to close to 600 cfs. It is recommended that the additional culvert is added to the dam.

- Determine the impact if a culvert is installed crossing Spring Hill Drive at Palisades Trail to carry a portion of the flow on the north side of the road

The secondary spillway (the grass depression in the SW corner of the impoundment) receives a flow of 7 cfs during the 100 year storm. It was assumed that adding a culvert would result in 3 cfs flowing North West in the Palisades Trail ditch. The results of the model as shown in table 2A and 2B.

Conclusion:

The flood elevations along Spring Hill Drive decreased; however, flood elevations on the creek are unaffected and the Spring Hill Drive Hydraulic Shadow in the affected area was minimal. The dam failure model accounts for 7 cfs flowing over the grass spillway to Spring Hill Drive. Redirecting 3 cfs away from the Spring Hill Drive area to the north ditch is minimal compared to 28 cfs jumping the bank within the golf course area and 560 cfs flowing down the creek. This option is not recommended.

- 3 Provide a dam failure analysis assuming a shallow berm parallel to the stream on the golf course to prevent the lateral flow flowing to Spring Hill Drive.

The lateral flow at this location was deleted from the model and a berm constructed higher than the 100 year flood elevation to prevent overtopping was added to several cross sections. The results of the model as shown in table 3.

Conclusion:

The flood elevations in the creek increased by ¾ to 1 inch with no lateral flow towards Spring Hill Drive. However, this increase of the creek will impact the floodway along the property north of the culvert/dam on the west side of Palisades Trail. FEMA would view the berm as a levee and the approval process is much more stringent than what it used to be since hurricane Katrina. The levee would need to be certified. The process is one to five years. In Wisconsin, there are only three certified levees. This option is not recommended due to the regulations that come with a levee and the other impacts.
