

Summer Projects Require Permits

If you are planning any construction or remodeling projects, we would like to remind you building permits are required for most projects, including:

GENERAL PERMITS: Installation/Replacement of siding and roofing, construction of stoops, ramps, sheds, and home alterations/remodeling projects.

TRADEWORK PERMITS: Separate permits are required for any electrical or plumbing work, to ensure your project meets Village zoning regulations and complies with Village and State building codes, but also lets us assist you in achieving a project that is safe and structurally sound.

LAND USE PERMITS: Land use permits are also required for the construction, erection, and placement of fences, decks, concrete slabs, patios, pergolas, and decks on properties as well as expansion of existing land use projects. This ensures the location, height, materials and maintenance of projects comply with Village regulations to prevent the creation of nuisances. For more information, contact the Village Office for further clarification.



Permits must be obtained before work begins.

Residents/Contractors are **required** to display permits in a **conspicuous location**. If you see work in your neighborhood being done without a permit, please alert the Village Office.

Medications Disposal

Old or unused medications can be safely disposed of at any of the following 24-hour "Safe Drug Drop Box" locations:

Appleton Police Dept. — 222 South Walnut Street, Appleton

Brillion Police Dept. — 130 Calumet Street, Brillion

Calumet County Sheriff Dept. — 206 Court Street, Chilton

Menasha Police Dept. — 430 1st Street, Menasha

Household pharmaceuticals accepted at the drop-off box include prescription and over-the-counter human and pet medications such as pills, capsules, ointments, liquids, sprays, drops, creams, inhalers, vials or any other drug no longer needed for its intended purpose. No needles, intravenous solutions, or non-medication waste. **Contact Calumet County Health Dept. at 920-849-1432 for safe needle disposal.**

Keep medications in the original container with the medication name kept visible. Personal identification information such as name and address on prescription labels can be crossed off with a black marker. Use of these drop box services is free. ▲

OTHER UTILITY ITEMS

New to the Village of Sherwood? Do you plan on planting a new lawn, doing major landscaping updates to your yard or filling a pool?

Seven years ago Sherwood constructed a pipeline to the City of Appleton in order to connect as a wholesale customer.

Some residents ask if there is a way to receive a discounted rate for planting lawns or doing major landscaping. Because we receive water from another municipality, we pay for 100% of all water pumped to your homes, regardless of where it ends up.

So, while you don't need a permit to water your new landscaping or lawn, the Village cannot grant discounted rates. ▲

Village-wide Reminder - All Homes Require an E-Sign

Per Village Municipal Code 23 (7-11), all homes and businesses in the Village of Sherwood are required to have a green emergency sign displayed in front of their property (either affixed to their mailbox or on the side on a post). Do you have a new home that does not have one of these signs? Or an older home and the sign has gone missing? Please contact the Village Office so we can provide you with a sign. (New homes have their e-sign included in their permit fees —replacements may have a fee to reprint.)

All homes must have proper emergency signs at their residences as an identification means for all emergency-related services. Please note that alternate identification does not supercede local E-signs. ▲

Bird City Update

A State Park, the Niagara Escarpment, a beautiful shoreline of the 137,000 acre Lake Winnebago, miles of paved and unpaved walking, bicycling, horseback trails and rolling farm fields provide plenty of bird habitats, . . .

So you live in a wonderful place to become a birder. No matter where you live in Sherwood, no matter how old or how young, no matter if you have all day or have just a little free time, becoming a birder might be just right for you.

There are three easy steps to begin one of the most interesting, challenging and just plain fun hobbies – Bird watching.

Spend some time getting to know your feathered friends. There are specials on TV, the Internet is full of information, your public libraries have hundreds of books about birds and now that you have some information and a little excitement get a Wisconsin Bird book/field guide with photos.

Binoculars. Really any binoculars will do at first as long as they make far away things a little larger. You might have a pair somewhere around your house. Use them.

Get out there! With field guide and binoculars in hand, you are ready to begin your birding journey. On Audubon News, Nicholas Lund suggests "pick a bird and go find it." Use that field guide you bought and pick a bird you've never seen before—one that you're reasonably sure lives nearby at that time of year—and go find it. There are a lot of resources you can use to determine what birds have been seen nearby, like the "explore data" section of eBird or postings on your local [birding listserv](http://birding.listserv). Then just go out into the actual world and start looking until you find it."

That's it! Congratulations – You are a birder!

Electronics Ban Reminder



Effective Sept. 1, 2010, Wisconsin's Electronics Recycling Law (2009 Act 50) prohibits disposal of certain electronic devices in Wisconsin landfills, burning in an incineration facility, or placing these devices in a container intended for disposal or incineration.

This ban does not require a solid waste treatment or disposal facility to retrieve a consumer video display device (a television or computer monitor with a tube or a screen that is at least 7" in its longest diagonal measurement) if doing so is impractical or would jeopardize the safety of a worker, or if the device has been damaged to the extent that recycling is no longer practical or feasible.

Electronic devices included in the ban are computers, printers, video display devices, peripherals, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs, and other video players (i.e. DVRs).

If you'd like to get rid of your electronics, please utilize Outagamie County's Recycling Center (1919 Holland Road, Appleton, 54911. Find out hours of operation and accepted items at www.recyclemoreoutagamie.org.▲

Hazardous wastes that can be brought to the disposal program include, but are not limited to, solvents, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides, rodent baits, lead and oil based paints, kitchen and bathroom cleaners, bug sprays, old gasoline, transmission fluid and antifreeze. **Latex paint IS NOT ACCEPTED.** ▲

Requirements (per WI State Regulations):

Temperature outside must be 63 degrees Fahrenheit or warmer.
Must not be raining outside (or have rain in the forecast).
Water feature shut down is subject to inclement weather.

To Turn Feature on:

Gate is a safety feature – lift latch open on any gate.
Locate one of the two green pillars inside the splash pad feature and tap the button on top. Splash pad feature runs in a 3-minute cycle. Pressing pillar button again to reactivate.

Hours of Operation:

Memorial Day (5/29) through Labor Day (9/5) from 9 AM to 9 PM.




