## Code Reminders

### NUISANCES (7-10)

**NOXIOUS WEEDS** — Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes, Section 66.96 and Section 7-10f of the Village Municipal Code, notice is hereby given to each person who owns, occupies, or controls land in the Village of Sherwood, Calumet County, WI to DESTROY ALL NOXIOUS WEEDS AND CUT RANK GROWTH on such property. Noxious weeds are: Canada Thistle, Leafy Spurge, Field Bindweed (Creeping Jenny), Lythrum (Purple Loosestrife), and Multiflora Rose. **Photographs and additional information on these noxious weeds are on our website at [www.villageofsherwood.org/weeds](http://www.villageofsherwood.org/weeds).**

Rank growth includes lawns, grasses, and other vegetative growth on undeveloped lots or platted parcels of land which exceed **eight (8) inches in length** except for property in designated floodplain, wetland, or storm water detention areas.

If you fail to comply to the parcel vegetative height allowance, a subcontractor (or Village Public Works) cut the rank growth at the property owner's expense and other related charges (costs associated with subcontractor plus Village municipal fees, which are more severe for each offense) shall be rolled to tax roll if left unpaid.

 **NOISE** — Nice weather brings people outdoors. Please be considerate of your neighbors. Windows are open, welcoming the fresh air; be aware of noise pollution especially during night hours (10 PM to 7 AM). Besides prohibiting noxious weeds, Village Code 7-10 prohibits public nuisances such as animals running at large, fireworks, junk vehicles, and loud and unnecessary noise.

 **DOGS** — Please be considerate of your neighbors and don't let your dog roam outside the yard or bark excessively. When walking around the neighborhood or on one of our many trails, please pick up your litter and clean up after Fido. (We now have numerous doggie waste stations throughout the Village for easy disposal!) Dogs must be licensed, leashed and within your control.

## From the Village Administrator...

### Move over Winter and bring on Spring!

Move over Winter and bring on Spring! It's time to think about spring planting, and outside projects — including home, business and roadway construction.

Last year was a banner year for home construction as we issued 47 new home permits. That trend will inevitably slow down this year as we are running out of available lots for sale — which also means we will likely see a new subdivision plan come forward sometime in the next twelve months.

In the *historic downtown* area, the *Community Development Authority (CDA)* recently had a home on CTH 'M' removed for future commercial parking area. It has also funded the removal of three older homes near the Post Office. Coupled with removing the *Wink-Mart* gas station several years ago and last year's closing of Condon Road at the STH 55/114 intersection, by early this Summer the entire area will be transformed into bare ground ready for commercial redevelopment, or development of a *Senior Housing* complex of market-rate condos and/or apartments.

The CDA has discussed commercial opportunities in this area as well as down the hill near the Mobil gas station and towards the grocery store. Also, it continues to make available funds supporting a *50/50 Business Matching Grant Program* to help business owners make upgrades to their businesses. If you know a business owner who wishes to engage the process, please have them contact the Village Offices for details. Our efforts are aimed at filling a housing need that will help define the downtown area, supporting local businesses, and enticing new commercial business to serve our community and the many visitors of High Cliff State Park.

This summer's large roadway project involves reworking ditching on Lake Breeze Drive and the adjoining cul-de-sacs (Parkway, Nature, Morningstar, Palmer, Nicklaus) between STH 55/114 and Cliff View Drive. Over time, as grassed ditches fill in, it is imperative to rework these drainage swales to ensure proper stormwater flow — in this case, into the State Park Estates ponds immediately to the west. Lake Breeze will be repaired between STH 55/114 and Nicklaus Court.

On the Parks, Recreation & Urban Tree (PRUT) front, Brenda Stumpf had served the Village on a contract hire basis for 3+ years and has now been hired as our first-ever, full-time Park & Recreation Coordinator. Also, the Nuthatch Trail section under repair is scheduled to be completed and re-asphalted by the end of May, if the weather cooperates. And, in continuing our goal of reforesting our local tree population as a *Tree City* and *Wisconsin Bird City*, we have ordered an additional 1,500 seedlings for planting this Spring, bringing our effort to over 6,000 trees planted.

## From the Village Clerk-Treasurer

**237 DOGS REMAIN UNLICENSED** — Starting April 1, a \$5 late fee will be charged in addition to the licensing fee. It's State law — all dogs five (5) months and older must be licensed annually by March 31. Proof of a current rabies vaccination is required. This year's licenses are GOLD. If your dog's tag is BLUE, it's expired and must be renewed.



For your convenience, you may handle your license renewal by mail; please include proof of rabies vaccination, license fee (include an extra \$5 after March 31) and a self-addressed, stamped envelope. Late fees are waived for newly acquired dogs or puppies.

Neighbors and meter readers also reported several unlicensed dogs. **If you no longer have your pet, please contact the Village Office so we can remove the pet from our database.**

## Bird City Update

**"The Warbler's are Coming!"** Springtime is a wonderful time to be a birdwatcher. Wisconsin is home to more than 30 species of colorful, melodic Warblers. These mostly insect eating birds, forage and nest in woodlands including woodlots in your own yard or nearby parks. High Cliff State Park and the Butterfly Trail at the park are ideal locations to view warblers.



The best time to see these beautiful birds is usually late April and May as they make their way further north.

A special day is even set aside to recognize migratory birds. International Migratory Bird Day is May 13th. Pack a picnic, bring the kids and visit High Cliff State Park on that Saturday. Bring your binoculars, hike through the woods and join with people around the world witness the wonders of bird migration.

So this Spring enjoy watching these delightful birds and listen for their sweet songs.

\*\*\*Please be aware that outdoor cats are the single greatest human-caused mortality for birds. A new study by scientists at the Smithsonian Conservation Biology Institute and from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's division of Migratory Birds have estimated that bird mortality is now estimated to be 1.4 to 3.7 billion.

### Greetings from the Park and Recreation Department!!!

We have been busy planning activities for everyone, so please take the opportunity to check out everything we will be offering. Some new things this year include 2 bus trips. The first is to Warrens Cranberry Festival, on Saturday, September 23. A fun-filled opportunity for all, the day will consist of farmers markets, flea markets, food vendors and craft booths. (Registration forms are at the Village Office.) The second is a trip to the Gurnee Mills Shopping Mall on Saturday, December 2. Both of these trips require signing up so if you are interested, sign-up before it is too late.

## Trash and Recycling Updates

### TIRE RECYCLING EVENT—SATURDAY, APRIL 22

On Saturday, April 22, from 8 AM to Noon come on out to either New Holstein Public Works Garage (1319 Taft Avenue, New Holstein ) or Officials Den Bowl & Spirits (408 N. 8th St., Hilbert). Tire tickets must be purchased in advance and are available at the Village Office (cost is \$5 per tire; limit 10 tires per person; no tractor tires accepted). No money will be exchanged at the event.

### BULK-ITEM PICK-UP — MONDAY, MAY 15

This is the **ONLY** bulk item pick-up date for the Village. Please note that items must be at curbside by 6 AM to ensure pick-up. (*Be sure to update your calendar—the previous newsletter had the incorrect date.*)

**Items accepted for collection include:** Furniture, rolled carpeting (4 foot maximum length), cabinets, countertops, mattresses/bed springs, non-metal doors, wood windows, wooden playground equipment, large appliances without Freon (stoves, washers, dryers, etc. allowed if item can be handled by two people safely).

**Excluded items for collection include:** Uncontainerized items or piles of construction material, tires, batteries, TVs/DVD players/VCRs, computer equipment, liquid, yard waste items, engines/products run on petroleum, and electronic items banned from landfills.

Freon-containing items (refrigerators, AC units, freezers, old dehumidifiers) are also prohibited for collection. If you have an appliance with Freon, please contact the Village Office to find out how to properly dispose the item.

## Sherwood Water & Sewer Utility

**What is a Cross Connection?** - A cross connection is an actual or potential connection between the safe drinking water (potable) supply and a source of contamination or pollution. State plumbing codes require approved backflow prevention methods to be installed at every point of potable water connection and use. Cross-connections must be properly protected or eliminated.

**How does contamination occur?** - When you turn on your faucet, you expect the water to be as safe as when it left the treatment plant. However, certain hydraulic conditions left unprotected within your plumbing system may allow hazardous substances to contaminate your own drinking water or even the public water supply.

**Backsiphonage** — May occur due to a loss of pressure in the municipal water system during a fire fighting emergency, a water main break or system repair. This creates a siphon in your plumbing system, which can draw water out of a sink or bucket and back into your water or the public water system.

**Backpressure** — May be created when a source of pressure (such as a boiler) creates a pressure greater than the pressure supplied from the public water system. This may cause contaminated water to be pushed into your plumbing system through an unprotected cross connection.


#### Hand Held Shower Fixture

**A hand held shower is compliant if:**

- 1 — When shower head is hanging freely, it is at least 1" above top of the flood level rim of the receptor (tub)
- 2 — Complies with **ASSE#1014**
- 3 — Has the **ASME code 112.18.1** stamped on the handle



1" Minimum AIR GAP Above Tub From Fixture Outlet




#### Toilet Tanks


There are many unapproved toilet tank fill valve products sold at common retailers which do not meet the state plumbing code requirements for backflow prevention:

- 1 — Look for the **ASSE #1002 Standard** symbol on the device and packaging
- 2 — Replace any unapproved devices with **ASSE #1002** approved anti-siphon ball-cock assembly. Average cost is typically \$12 to \$22 at home improvement stores.
- 3 — Verify overflow tube is 1" below critical level (CL) marking on the device.

### — IN THE KITCHEN —



Hoses and water treatment devices may create a potential backflow hazard if not properly isolated with backflow prevention methods.

#### Did You Know... ?

Your water can become contaminated if connections of your plumbing system are not properly protected! The purpose of the local Cross-Connection Control Program, as required by the State Plumbing Code and Regulations (and WI Dept. of Natural Resources), is to ensure that everyone in the community has safe, clean drinking water.

To avoid contamination, backflow preventers are required by State Plumbing Code wherever there is an actual or potential hazard for cross-connection.

All public water suppliers are required to maintain an on-going Cross-Connection Program involving public education, onsite inspections, and possible corrective actions by building owners if required.


#### Insights to Protect Your Drinking Water...

**Do:** 1 — Keep the ends of hoses clear of all possible contaminants.

2 — Make sure dishwashers are installed with a proper "air gap" device.

3 — Verify and install a **hose bibb vacuum breaker** on all threaded faucets around your home.


4 — Make sure water treatment devices such as water softeners have the proper "air gap", which is a minimum of 1" inch above any drain.



**Don't:** 1 — Submerge hoses in buckets, pools, tubs, sinks or ponds.

2 — Use spray attachments without a backflow prevention device.

3 — Connect waste pipes from water softeners or other treatment systems directly to the sewer or submerged drain pipe. Always be sure there is a 1" "air gap" separation.

**NEW METER EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION NOTICE** — The Village of Sherwood is in the process of transitioning its water read equipment to radio transmission. As a customer of Sherwood Water & Sewer Utility, please be advised that this project will span over the next three (3) years, starting this calendar year.

We will be sending out formal notices to the effected customers for 2017; the vast majority effected this year would include those on Pigeon Road to the western side of the Village.

We kindly ask for your cooperation on this important project, so to ensure the Village's proper compliance with the WI Public Service Commission.

**HYDRANT FLUSHING** — The Sherwood Water Dept. will begin its annual flushing program on **May 1 through May 12**, excluding weekends. **Flushing will be done during daylight hours from 7:30 AM to 3:00 PM.**

Customers are advised to check for discoloration prior to washing clothes. If water utility employees are seen working in your area, please use as little, or if possible, no water for 45 minutes to insure the water has settled and discoloration is not drawn into the home's water heater or softener. We advise that you wait until 4:00 PM before washing clothes to minimize potential discoloration.

If discoloration persists, customers are advised to wait another 30-45 minutes, then draw from the discolored water through the **COLD WATER FAUCET ONLY**. Flushing removes most of the sediment of natural minerals such as iron and sulfur that are harmless, but can discolor water.

**FATS, OILS, GREASE** — Household greases ("cooking oils" and "fat byproducts") are not to be disposed of down your kitchen sink/toilet into the sanitary sewers. Please throw products in the trash.

**HYGIENIC PRODUCTS NOT FLUSHABLE** — Do **NOT** flush products such as sanitary napkins, disposable baby wipes/wet wipes, or dental floss. The package may be market the item "flushable", but unfortunately causes backup issues and headaches for our utility personnel. Please help our WWTP by throwing these hygiene products in the trash.

### CALUMET COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

**SCAM ALERT:** Several phone scams are going on and numerous Calumet County residents have been victimized. The Sheriff's Department wants to stress that no government agency will call you demanding money or your social security number. If residents get a phone call saying they won a prize in a raffle they never entered, they didn't win. It's a scam! You should never be told to go to Wal Mart or Walgreens and buy a "green dot" card and then told to deposit ANY money onto the card. The crooks have been successful convincing numerous residents to do these actions. The crook then wants the numbers off the "green dot" card and then has access to all the money placed on the card. Law enforcement can't track these cards and the victims are out hundreds of dollars. Another scam going on right now is where somebody calls you saying you have a computer problem or virus. Hang up on them. They want you to give them access to your computer where they will disable it until you give them hundreds of dollars. Numerous residents have been victimized by this scam as well. The other popular scam going on right now is where you may get a phone call telling you your relative has been involved in auto crash or arrested in a foreign country. The caller will tell you that you need to wire money to them to get the relative out of jail or to post bond from the car accident. Hang up on these people.

### SPRING CLEANING MEANS TIME TO CLEAR OUT THE MEDICINE CABINET:

Medicines can get old, and you may have drugs that you no longer use. Do not flush medicines down the sink or toilet because this can make our water supply unsafe. Dispose unused medicines at a local drug take-back program. People who live in Calumet County can drop off unused or old medicines for free at the Calumet County Sheriff's Dept., or the Police Depts. in Appleton, New Holstein, Brillion, and Menasha.

When cleaning out the medicine cabinet, do not give them away to friends or family. A medicine that works for you could be very bad for someone else. You can follow these steps for safe disposal:

1. Empty pills into a clear, sealed, sandwich sized bag.
2. Keep liquids, creams, and powders in the original containers.
3. Drop off bags of pills, liquids, creams, and powders at the above designated spots.

You can recycle empty pill bottles and paper boxes with your own home recycling items, but remember to scratch out your name on the label to keep your personal information safe.
