
### FREE MULCH & COMPOST!!!

Free mulch and compost is available to all residents at the yard waste site. Look for the mounds when you drive straight into the site. Please no loaders; mulch and compost can be shoveled into buckets or trailers. Thank you.

### YARD WASTE SITE IS OPEN!!!

The site (at intersection of Kesler and Military Rds.) is open to residents for disposal of grass clippings, brush, branches (up to 4" in width), and leaves May through October. Hours of operation are Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2 PM to 6 PM and Saturdays from 8 AM to 1 PM. Hours for November will only be the first three Saturdays from 9AM to Noon. Please keep in mind the keeping and/or raising of farm animals, including but not limited to goats, pigs, cows, sheep, ducks, geese, chickens, ponies, and horses, was declared a public nuisance and is prohibited within any area zoned residential by the zoning regulations of the Village by Ordinance §4.49.



## SUMMER REMINDERS FROM PUBLIC WORKS

- Please remember landowners are prohibited to have grasses, lawns, and other vegetation such as noxious weeds and rank growth exceeding in eight (8) inches in length or more per Village Municipal Code 7-10(f).
- When mowing, please direct the clippings away from roadways and sidewalks. Clippings can clog the storm drains, cause drainage issues, and add unwanted material to the stormwater ponds.
- No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed on Village trails, including ATVs and construction vehicles.
- The rip rap around stormwater ponds stabilize the pond banks. Please do not throw the surrounding rocks into the ponds.

### **From the Friends of High Cliff State Park:**

As Summer is fast approaching the *Friends* are busy helping the park staff with enhancement and maintaining one of Wisconsin's Seven Wonders. People who visit for the first time are in awe of all the natural beauty that High Cliff possesses such as the Niagara Escarpment, Lake Winnebago, the Butterfly Pond trails, numerous recreation opportunities, the Native American Mounds and the list goes on.

At present, we are in the process of completing the update of the Gathering Place, known to most as the Upper Pavilion. Updates include new windows, doors, floors, and a caterer's kitchen on the inside, and updating of accessible walkways, roof gutters, drinking fountain, etc. on the outside. The *Friends* are also working on updating/repairs to the two accessible fishing piers, in addition to helping the marina with new cushions on the boat landing and helping with the cost of replacing a sanitary pump. Members and non-members of the *Friends* have stepped forward to help with the work and use of their talents, as we have a very small park staff and summers are so busy at High Cliff. We are the third busiest park in the state.

On the "Nature" side of the park, the *Friends* and Village of Sherwood have been working together with a retired biologist to enhance our standing as a "Bird City" by helping to support the Banding of 10 Purple Martins with GPS Geolocators and 50 with regular bands. This will allow our park, village, schools and other interested persons to follow the High Cliff Purple Martin Colony to know where they roost, migrate for Winter, when they arrive for their winter home and when they begin migrating back to their High Cliff/Sherwood home. It will also provide information about colonies of the bird seem to be diminishing. As information is gathered we will post it on the *Friends of High Cliff* Facebook Page and Website. At this time we have no precise date of the banding but will do our best to get information out to everyone so you can participate and observe.

The Campground Halloween Event is scheduled for Saturday, October 6 this year. Please plan on joining in the fun.

**SPLASH PAD INFORMATION**

**Requirements (per WI State Regulations):**

- Temperature outside must be 63 degrees Fahrenheit or warmer.*
- Must not be raining outside (or have rain in the forecast).*
- Water feature shut down is subject to inclement weather.*

**To Turn Feature on:**

- Gate is a safety feature – lift latch open on any gate. Locate one of the two green pillars inside the splash pad feature and tap the button on top.*
- Splash pad feature runs in 3-minute cycles. Pressing pillar button again reactivates the cycle.*

**Hours of Operation:**

*Memorial Day (5/28) through Labor Day (9/3) from 10AM to 8 PM.*

**Please note:** *Splash pad automatically shuts down due to mechanical or chemical-related issues without notice. We apologize in advance for any inconvenience, and will try and fix problems as soon as possible.*

**UTILITY NEWS AND REMINDERS:**

**NEW METER EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION NOTICE** — The Village of Sherwood is in the process of transitioning its water read equipment to radio transmission. As a customer of Sherwood Water & Sewer Utility, please be advised that this project will span over the next two (2) years since the project’s start last year.

We will send out formal notices to affected customers in 2018 and ask for your cooperation on this important project to ensure proper compliance with WI Public Service Commission regulations.

**WATERING?** Do you plan on planting a new lawn, major landscaping updates to your yard or filling a pool?

Eight years ago Sherwood constructed a pipeline to the City of Appleton in order to connect as a wholesale customer.

Because we receive water from another municipality, we pay for 100% of all water pumped to your homes, regardless of where it ends up. Some residents ask if there is a way to receive a discounted rate for planting lawns or doing major landscaping. You don’t need a permit to water new landscaping or lawn. However, the Village does not grant discounted rates. ▲
