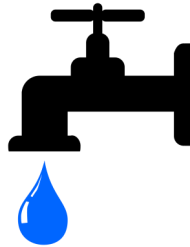

Greetings Residents and Businesses,


I want to say thank you for voting and appreciate the support for me in the election this past April. I look forward to serving all the residents of our Village.

A warm welcome to our new residents and new business Mud Creek Coffee.

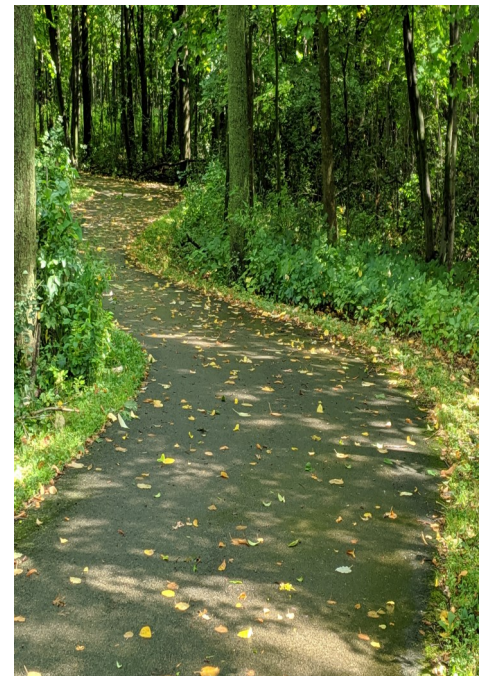

SUMMER REMINDERS FROM PUBLIC WORKS

- Please remember landowners are prohibited to have grasses, lawns, and other vegetation such as noxious weeds and rank growth exceeding in eight (8) inches in length or more per Village Municipal Code 7-10(f).
- When mowing, please direct the clippings away from roadways and sidewalks. Clippings can clog the storm drains, cause drainage issues, and add unwanted material to the stormwater ponds.
- No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed on Village recreation trails, including ATVs, golf carts and construction vehicles.
- The rip rap around stormwater ponds stabilize the pond banks. Please do not throw the surrounding rocks into the ponds as this will lead to bank erosion.

UTILITY NEWS AND REMINDERS:

WATERING? Do you plan on planting a new lawn, major landscaping updates to your yard or filling a pool?

Nine years ago Sherwood constructed a pipeline to the City of Appleton in order to connect as a wholesale customer.

Because we receive water from another municipality, we pay for 100% of all water pumped to your homes, regardless of where it ends up. Some residents ask if there is a way to receive a discounted rate for planting lawns or doing major landscaping. You don't need a permit to water new landscaping or lawn. However, the Village does not grant discounted rates.

Prepare Now for Summer Heat

Residents reminded to stay cool, hydrated, and informed when temperatures soar

Summer is upon us. Extreme heat days are something we experience in Wisconsin. The Department of Health Services and Calumet County Public Health encourages residents to be aware of the signs and symptoms of heat-related illness and to take steps to prevent getting sick.

In 2020, 689 people went to the emergency department; 67 people were hospitalized; and seven people died in Wisconsin due to heat-related causes. Emergency department visits were highest among younger populations aged 15-34. Hospitalizations were most frequent among those aged 65 and older. “Temperatures in Wisconsin are projected to keep increasing over time due to climate change. Wisconsinites need to be on alert for extremely warm days and proactively take steps to ensure their safety,” said Dr. Jon Meiman, chief medical officer of the Bureau of Environmental and Occupational Health.

Some people are more likely to get sick from the heat, including:

- Older adults and younger children
- People who work outside
- People attending summer festivals
- People without access to air conditioning
- People who take certain medications like diuretics (“water pills”) or psychotropics

Follow these tips to stay cool on hot days:

- **Stay in air conditioning.** When possible, stay in air conditioning on hot days. If you don’t have air conditioning, head to libraries, stores, shopping malls, and other public spaces to keep cool.
- **Check on loved ones.** Be sure to check on older friends and neighbors who live alone.
- **Avoid the hottest part of the day.** If you have to be outside, stick to the cooler morning and evening hours. Wear light, loose clothing and take frequent, air conditioned or shade breaks.
- **Beware of hot cars.** Never leave a person or a pet in a parked car, even for a short time. On an 80 degree day, the temperature inside a car can reach 100 degrees in less than 10 minutes.
- **Stay hydrated.** Drink plenty of water on hot days. Avoid alcohol and hot, heavy meals.
- **Stay informed.** Watch your local weather forecasts so you can plan outdoor activities safely. Pay attention to any extreme heat alerts.

Remember that anyone can get sick from the heat. In Wisconsin, people ages 15-34 are the most likely to report to the ER for getting sick from the heat. No matter your age or how healthy you are, it’s important to stay cool, hydrated, and informed on hot days.

If you start feeling overheated, weak, dizzy, nauseated, or have muscle cramps, you could be experiencing heat illness. Move to air conditioning, drink water, get under a fan, and put cool washcloths on exposed skin. If your symptoms worsen or don’t improve, go to the emergency room.
